FIELD NOTE

Salmon Creek
Sonoma County

Capt. Lee Shea was contacted in Santa Rosa during a brief but extensive survey trip to obtain data on the catchable trout policy and management plans for the north coastal area. Capt. Shea noted (1) that there was nothing but private property where fishing is not permitted along a 1 mile stretch of this stream which takes in the best of the winter silver salmon fishing, and (2) that this stream is entirely open to summer fishing on both sides of the one mile stretch mentioned above. Capt. Shea made specific recommendations: first, that catchable rainbow trout be planted in the lagoon at the State Park near the mouth, and two, that stocking should take place anytime after June 1, and periodically after that.

FIELD NOTES

As part of the over-all 1953-54 winter steelhead fishery creel census, the following record was taken by Warden Jack B. Wilson on this date. Twenty anglers fishing a total of 39 hours caught 13 silver salmon ranging from 2.5 lbs. to 10 lbs. It was estimated by Warden Wilson that there was a total of 50 anglers fishing the entire stream on this date.
